Tina Altieri

Master of Ceremonies

Tina Altieri is a dynamic and engaging communicator who has earned great respect through her 20 years in the Australian broadcast news business.

She commenced her career in the media as a radio reporter, shortly after joining the Channel Ten Eyewitness News team and, in doing so, became the youngest newsreader in Australia. Tina made her screen debut at age 19.

For the past 20 years she has been in lounge rooms all over Australia and New Zealand in her capacity as a News and Current Affairs anchor woman for the Nine Network, Seven Network and SkyNews Australia.

In addition to her TV duties with the Channel 7 Network's Today Tonight program, Tina is currently a sought-after and accomplished compere and public speaker in South East Asia.



David Bain

New Zealand

On June 20 1994 horrified New Zealanders awoke to the news of the Bain family murders. Five people had been shot as they lay sleeping at 65 Every Street, Andersons Bay, Dunedin. The news bulletins said one family member had survived and as yet no one had been charged. From the outset there was strong speculation that the father Robin Bain had killed his family, then himself, sparing only eldest son David, but four days later, New Zealand got its second big shock that week, when police arrested 22-year-old David Bain, and charged him with killing his family.

At his first trial in 1995, Bain was found guilty of the murders of his parents, two sisters and brother in the family's home. He served 12 years of a minimum 16 year jail sentence before the Privy Council ruled in May 2007 that there had been a substantial miscarriage of justice.

This conference will be the first time David has spoken publicly about his experience.



Dr Rubin Carter

Ambassador of JUSTICEwa

Rubin Carter was born in Clifton, New Jersey.

A distinctive fighter with an awesome left hook, shaved head and baleful stare, Carter scored many early round knockouts, and earned the name "Hurricane". As Carter was preparing to fight for the middleweight championship a second time, his career came to a shuddering halt. He and teenager, John Artis, were arrested in 1966 for the murder of three whites in a New Jersey bar. Although steadfastly maintaining their innocence, Carter and Artis were convicted and sentenced to triple-life terms, narrowly escaping the electric chair.

In 1976, the New Jersey Supreme Court threw out the convictions because the state witnesses had committed perjury and vital evidence had been withheld from the defense. A new trial ensued, but the injustice was repeated. Reconvicted and reincarcerated, Carter languished in prison until 1985 when he finally had the opportunity to present his claims to a federal court. The U.S. District Court ruled that Carter's conviction had been based on "racism rather than reason and concealment rather than disclosure and that his imprisonment had been a travesty". On November 8, 1985, he was freed after serving more than 19 years for a crime he did not commit.



Lindy Chamberlain -Creighton

Australia

On 17 August 1980, Lindy Chamberlain's daughter, nine week old Azaria Chamberlain, was taken by a dingo from a camping ground near Ayers Rock. Lindy was tried and convicted of the murder of her baby daughter and sentenced to life in prison with hard labour. In 1986 Lindy was released pending a 14 month Royal Commission which in 1988 found her innocent.

A third inquest was held and on December 13 1995 in which Northern Territory Coroner John Lowndes once again cleared Lindy of all convictions, although in the 107 page decision he refused to determine the cause and manner of the disappearance and death of Azaria. Lindy's autobiography *Through My Eyes* was published in 1990 and reprinted in 2004. In 1988 the movie on the extraordinary Chamberlain story, *Evil Angels (overseas A Cry in the Dark)* was released, starring Meryl Streep and Sam Neill.

There is still enormous media interest in Lindy and her life. Lindy is an intelligent and articulate person who speaks publicly on a variety of topics including how to deal with the media, and it's responsibilities in news reporting; lawyer's responsibilities to seek the truth and be impartial; and prison life. She also speaks on divorce; grief, stress, loss and forgiveness.

Lindy is a patron of JUSTICEwa.



Gerard Dutton

Australia

Gerard Dutton is one of Australia's senior and most accomplished forensic firearms experts having been involved in the technical investigation of crime involving firearms for over 23 years.

He began his ballistics career with NSW Police in 1987 and in 1995 moved to Hobart as OIC of the Tasmania Police Ballistics Section. Gerard has written over 60 papers in a diverse range of forensic and technical journals which have won over a dozen national/international awards and he has presented on ballistics related topics all around Australia and in the USA, Canada and New Zealand. Gerard has been a member and chairman of numerous scientific working groups and committees relating to his discipline and co-wrote a 700+ page training manual which for the first time standardised the training provided by police jurisdictions in Australia to new trainees in forensic firearms investigation.

He is President of the Tasmanian Branch of the Australian and New Zealand Forensic Science Society (ANZFSS) and Chairman for the ANZFSS 21st International Symposium on the Forensic Sciences to be held in Hobart in late September 2012. Gerard has orally delivered expert firearms evidence many hundreds of times in courts of all jurisdictions in NSW, Tasmania and in the High Court of New Zealand.



Clint Hampson

Australia

Clint Hampson is highly qualified in the field of forensic science, having completed a bachelor of medical science (Curtin), a Masters in Forensic science (UWA) and he has recently submitted his PhD in Forensic Science (Liverpool University). Clint was formerly a member of the WA Police service before moving to the UK to take up an academic position at Liverpool University where he taught and carried out research in the fields of DNA, blood spatter analysis, crime scene management, fingerprinting, forensic photography and digital forensics. During this time he was engaged as an International Forensic Consultant by the UK Foreign Commonwealth office.

Since moving back to Australia Clint has taken up the position as Managing Director of Forensic Pathways, an award winning International company that specialises in innovative forensic solutions, advanced data analytics and forensic intelligence, crime scene/ forensic equipment as well as DNA products and services. With its diverse range of experts and collaboration with internationally accredited laboratories the company engages in forensic consultancy and offers a unique case review service to the law fraternity in Australia.



Joe Karam

New Zealand

Joe Karam was born in New Zealand in 1951. He represented his country playing for the All Blacks rugby team and then had a successful business career.

In 1996 he was attracted to an article showing a photo of a group of people known as "Friends of David Bain" who were protesting his innocence. He became embroiled in the case and was primarily responsible for the re-investigation which took place, challenging nearly every aspect of the Police case. His work ultimately led to David being acquitted on all charges at a retrial in 2009.

He dedicated 13 years to constant legal and public battles at great cost to himself and his family. He wrote two best-sellers, *David and Goliath* (1997) and *Bain and Beyond* (2000) and a third is in the pipeline. In 2001 he brought Rubin Carter to New Zealand to raise the profile of the miscarriage of justice.

Today he is assisting David in his quest for compensation for the 13 years of wrongful imprisonment he suffered. For Joe and his children now, David is "one of the family".



Paul Meyer

Australia

Paul Meyer is the Principal of Thames Legal, he obtained a Bachelor of Laws at the University of Westminster in London, England, and upon moving to Perth with his Australian wife, he enrolled at the University of Western Australia and completed a Graduate Diploma in Legal Practice.

Paul worked in the civil jurisdiction for approximately two years and after a short stint as a Legal Officer at the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions he commenced business as a Legal Practitioner specialising in criminal law; he's been doing this for the past six years.

Thames Legal is a small law firm that is frequently retained as instructing solicitors in appeal matters and has been involved in a number of high profile criminal cases in Western Australia.

Paul is a strong supporter of JUSTICEwa and is a member of the 2011/12 Strategy Committee.



Dr Thomas Müller

Austria

Dr Thomas Muller is an Austrian criminal psychologist, profiler and author. Dr Muller holds a degree in criminal justice, criminology and crime analysis. His contacts with the FBI and instruction experience in the USA with specials in criminal psychology qualify him as one of the world's most successful profilers. He has over 27 years experience in law enforcement.

While at the FBI in Quantico Dr Muller worked with renowned former FBI agent and criminologist Robert Ressler.

Dr Muller was active with others in identifying serial offenders Jack Unterweger (Austria), Horst David and Frank Gust (Germany), Moses Sithole (South Africa), Misha Ebner (Switzerland) and letter bomber Franz Fuchs (Austria).

His areas of expertise include homicide, sexual homicide, abnormal criminal psychology and behavior, criminal personality research, crime prevention, workplace violence, crime scene assessment, threat assessments and hostage negotiation.

Recently Dr Muller was involved in the high profile cases of Josef Fritzl and Armin Meiwes.

The German media often refer to Dr Muller as one of Europe's leading profilers.



Robin Napper

Australia

Former UK Detective Chief Inspector Robin Napper was trained in the old police methods – get a confession. But he’s now a messenger for the revolution in policing – forensically driven crime investigation.

He was at the forefront of the DNA revolution in the UK and he introduced it to NSW in 1998. He has years of experience and success in crime investigation, training, terrorism and prison security to back up his insistence that scientific based policing is the way ahead.

He was the Head of Operations of Britain’s National Crime Faculty – the centre for excellence and training for all UK police. He developed a national data base of top investigators and experts. He undertook a security review of all UK prisons, and he was part of a major operator to re-investigate cases that had gone cold using DNA, other forensic disciplines, and teams of experts.

He is called on by police from around the world for crime reviews, and training in forensically driven investigations through courses and demonstrations.

Robin is now based in Perth. He is a career Police Officer of 31 years’ experience, and has been involved in many hundreds of serious crime investigations.



Chris Ochoa

USA

Nancy DePriest was raped and murdered in her work place in Austin, Texas in 1988. Chris Ochoa pled guilty to the murder of DePriest and his friend, Richard Danziger, was convicted of rape. Ochoa had confessed to the crime and had implicated Danziger. It would be discovered, however, that his confession was coerced and that neither man had anything to do with the slaying or raping of DePriest.

Ochoa was greeted by the Wisconsin Innocence Project staff and students who helped him prove his innocence. Ochoa now states that his confession and implication of Danziger were the results of police pressure and fear of the death penalty, citing periods of time when they harassed him and threatened him with the consequences of not confessing.

Forensic Science Associates, a private forensic laboratory in California, had retained a sample from testing performed at the time of the trial in 1989. Using newer testing methods, FSA was able to exclude both Ochoa and Danziger as sources of the spermatozoa.

Chris Ochoa and Richard Danziger were exonerated in 2002.

This will be the first time Chris has traveled to Australia to tell this story.



Dr John Olsson

UK

Dr John Olsson has been practicing as an independent forensic linguistics expert since 1994, commissioned by law enforcement agencies, solicitors, government departments, companies and private clients.

He is on the United Kingdom National Crime Operations Faculty register (Centre for Policing Excellence, NPIA) as an expert. His work has been used in evidence in over 400 cases at the highest courts in the UK, the USA, Australia and Canada. He has worked on murder, suspicious death, terrorism, product contamination, witness intimidation, blackmail, fraud, sexual assault, armed robbery, money laundering, gang violence and narcotics investigations and has analysed all kinds of texts including ransom notes, suicide texts, threat texts, police statements and interviews and a variety of other types of documents and he has analysed the authorship of many cell phone text messages. In addition, he has assisted in a number of investigations involving electronic media, including email messages. He is widely published, two of his more popular titles being *Forensic Linguistics* and *Word crime*.

He holds postgraduate degrees from several British universities, with his doctorate research being on forensic authorship.



Robert Richter QC

Australia

Robert is considered to be one of the leading Queen’s Counsel barristers in Australia.

Born in Kyrgyzstan in 1945, Richter’s family arrived in Australia in 1959. Richter was admitted to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws in the late 1960s. He was “called to the bar” on 5 August 1971. A prominent critic of human rights violations and advocate for the rule of law.

In 1994, Richter successfully defended Victorian Police officer Cliff Lockwood in the Supreme Court of Victoria against charges that Lockwood allegedly murdered Walsh Street police shootings suspect Gary Abdallah in 1989.

In 2000 and 2003, Richter acted for then ATSIC chairman Geoff Clark.

In 2005, Richter successfully defended Melbourne underworld crime figure Mick Gatto against the charge of murdering suspected underworld hitman Andrew Veniamin.

He is a former chairman of the Criminal Bar Association, former President of Victorian Council for Civil Liberties, former part-time Law Reform Commissioner for Victoria and former member of Bar Council.

Robert is a patron of JUSTICEwa.



Barry C. Scheck

USA

Barry C. Scheck, is a Professor of Law at the Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law in New York City, where he has served for 31 years. Prof. Scheck and his colleague Peter Neufeld, Co-Founded and Co-Directed the Innocence Project, an independent non-profit organization closely affiliated with Cardozo Law School, which uses DNA evidence to exonerate the wrongly convicted. The Project also assists police, prosecutors, and defense attorneys in trying to bring about reform in many areas of the criminal justice system, including eyewitness identification procedures, interrogation methods, crime laboratory administration, and forensic science research. In its 18 years of existence, more than 270 individuals have been exonerated in the United States through post-conviction DNA (for more information: www.innocenceproject.org).

Barry C. Scheck is also a partner in the law firm Neufeld, Scheck & Brustin, LLP (formerly Cochran Neufeld & Scheck, LLP), specializing in civil rights and constitutional litigation. He has published extensively in these areas, including a book with Jim Dwyer and Peter Neufeld entitled, *Actual Innocence: When Justice Goes Wrong And How To Make It Right*.



Dr Richard Shepherd UK

Richard Shepherd is Visiting Professor at City University London and Honorary Consultant at The Royal Liverpool Hospital.

He is a registered UK Home Office Forensic Pathologist and a leading forensic pathologist in the UK. He has been involved in the investigation of natural, suicidal and homicidal deaths on behalf of both the defence and prosecution for more than 25 years and has experience in the field of deaths in custody and during restraint.

He is a member of the Ministerial Independent Advisory Panel on Deaths in Custody and also of the Restraint Accreditation Board and he has been a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Appeals Panel.

He was the forensic pathological expert for both the Bloody Sunday Inquiry and also for the Inquiry and Inquest into the deaths of Diana, Princess of Wales and Mr Dodi Al Fayed. He has recently provided the Attorney General with a review of the forensic pathological aspects of the death of Dr David Kelly, the UK Government Scientist. He was sent to New York to advise on management of UK fatalities following 9/11 and to Bali after the bomb attack on the Sari Club.



Joe Slemko

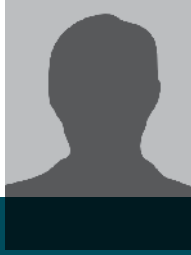
Canada

Joe Slemko is a police officer from Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, with 25 years of service. He is also a private consultant and a university instructor in the areas of criminal investigation techniques and the forensic sciences.

Since 1993 Joe's primary area of expertise has been in the science of bloodstain pattern analysis and crime scene reconstruction and has provided independent reviews of cases from throughout North America, the United Kingdom, Australia, Thailand and Singapore.

Joe's trusted objectivity has been highlighted in an article written by Canadian defence lawyer David Chow: "True expert opinion is neutral. It is not invested in one side of the case or another; rather, its aim is to ensure impartial and unbiased opinion based upon a foundation of proven evidence. A true expert, such as Cst. Slemko, gives due consideration to other possibilities, even if it means discounting his or her own views."

Joe's proudest accomplishments have been as a result of his involvement in a number of wrongful conviction cases and his presentation will highlight one of those cases. Joe will also discuss the biases and tunnel vision that may exist in expert scientific evidence and police investigations.

Philip Urquhart

Australia

Philip Urquhart graduated from the University of WA Law School in 1987. Since then he has practised almost exclusively in the area of criminal law. He was the youngest of 19 prosecutors at the Director of Public Prosecutions for WA when it was established in January 1992. He remained at the DPP for 13 years appearing as counsel in several hundred trials covering every court in WA with criminal jurisdiction. This included appearances in the Supreme Court as a prosecutor in a number of murder trials and in the Court of Appeal. He also represented the State in the High Court of Australia.

He joined the Western Australian Bar Association in 2005 as an independent barrister where he has continued to practise in the criminal and quasi-criminal areas, predominantly as a defence counsel.

He has been a guest lecturer and/or tutor at the Law Schools of the University of WA, Murdoch University and Notre Dame University. He has also been an instructor in various advocacy courses run by the Law Schools and the Law Society of WA.

He is currently a member of the Law Society's Criminal Law Committee and is the President of the Criminal Lawyers' Association of WA.



Dr Arthur Veno

Australia

Dr Arthur Veno is Adjunct Professor of Criminology at Monash University.

Arthur is dual citizen of Australia and the United States. Until high school, he was raised in France and several other European countries as the son in a US Army family. His education was at the prestigious University of California, San Francisco, where he took his Ph.D. in Social Psychology with minor papers in Criminology.

He was the Director of Police and Justice Studies at Monash for many years and has received numerous national and state awards for his work in violence prevention with both bikies and police.

From 2001-2005 he worked on a grant requiring him to ride with The South Australian Gypsy Jokers during their campaign to stop the introduction of the current anti-bikie legislation in South Australia and assisted the Secretariat of the Joint Parliamentary Committee reviewing the Australian Crime Commission's Serious and Organised Crimes Act in 2008.

He was awarded the Australian Psychological Society's Distinguished Career award for his work with bikies and police in 2007. He has never been a member of any club.



Betty Anne Waters

USA

What would you do if your loved one was sentenced to life in prison – and you were 100% certain of his innocence? Betty Anne Waters – inspiration for the major motion picture *Betty Anne Waters "Conviction"* starring Oscar© winner Hillary Swank – lived that nightmare when, in 1983, her brother was sentenced to life without parole for a murder and robbery he swore he didn't commit. When his appeals were shot down and funds for lawyers dwindled, Betty Anne decided to go to college and law school to get the credentials necessary to prove what she always knew: Kenneth Waters was innocent. At the podium, Betty Anne tells her incredible true story of how persistence and determination fueled by an unbending belief in her brother's innocence led to his exoneration in 2001.

With the Innocence Project's help, the male DNA found at the scene was ultimately tested which proved that it was not Kenneth's DNA – nor was he the perpetrator. The results were examined by the Massachusetts State Police Crime Laboratory and they concurred with FSA's findings. Kenneth was exonerated 2001; sadly six months after his release he was killed in a freak accident.

Betty Anne Waters lives in New England and continues her work in freeing wrongfully convicted criminals, as well as fighting for the rights of prison inmates.



Prof Paul Wilson

Australia

Professor Paul Wilson OAM is a criminologist and forensic psychologist who has worked on a number of miscarriages of justice cases.

Currently the Chair of Criminology at Bond University, Paul Wilson has spent a lot of time during his career exploring the nature of evil – whether people can be inherently evil or whether they just commit evil acts.

He has now spent more than 30 years as a criminologist and says that 20 years ago people would be fascinated to hear the details of his work or what case he was working on, but now they are not so impressed as we have become used to crime.

Formerly he held academic appointments at the University of Queensland and several American Universities. He also was a Fulbright Scholar.

He has authored 24 books on crime and related social issues and is an occasional columnist for several Australian newspapers. In 2003 he was awarded the Order of Australia Medal for 'services to education, particularly as a writer and lecturer in the field of criminology and to the community through raising public awareness of social justice issues'.

Professor Wilson's most recent book is *Dead Bodies Don't Count*.

He worked on the Graham Stafford wrongful conviction case.

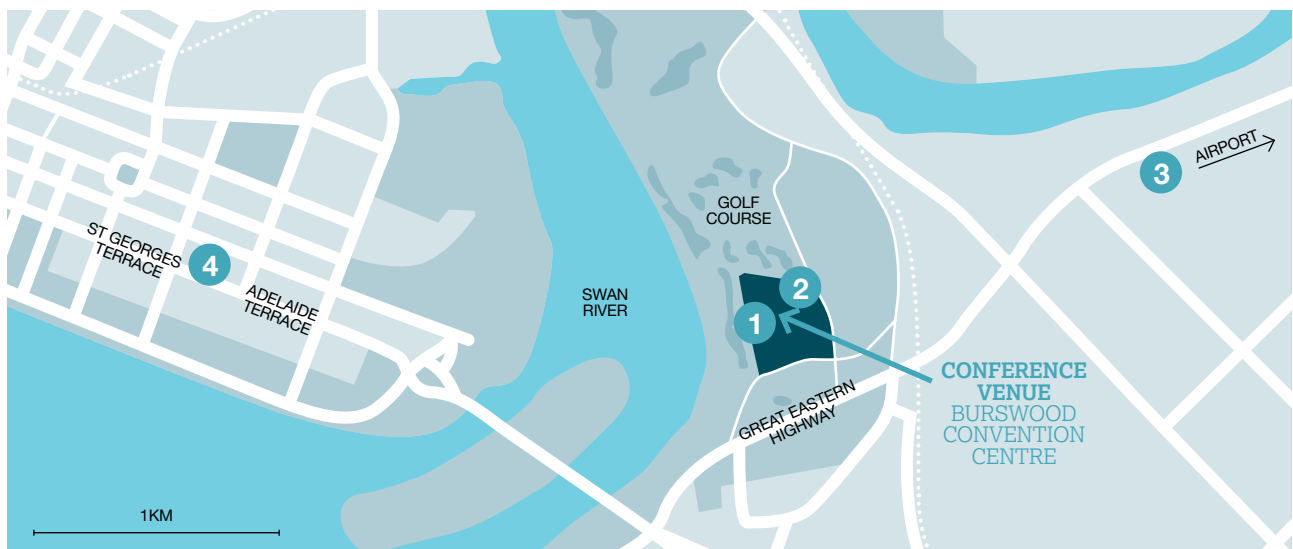

Australian Taxation Office Ruling (TR 98/9)

Para (1). Part A of this Ruling sets out the circumstances in which **self-education expenses are allowable as deductions** to individuals under the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936 (ITAA 1936) and the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (ITAA 1997). In doing so, the Ruling discusses the types of expenditure that are considered to be allowable.

Para (5). For the purposes of Part A of this Ruling, self-education includes courses undertaken at an educational institution (whether leading to a formal qualification or not), **attendance at work-related conferences or seminars**, self-paced learning and study tours, including sabbatical (whether within Australia or overseas).

Para (23). Subject to the general tests under section 8-1 being met, the following types of expenses related to self-education are allowable:

- (a) **Course or tuition fees of attending** an educational institution, work-related conference or seminar, including student union fees;
- (b) The cost of professional and trade journals, text books and stationery;
- (c) **Airfares** incurred on overseas study tours or sabbatical, on work-related conferences or seminars, or attending an educational institution. They are part of the necessary cost of participating in the tour, etc.
- (d) subject to paragraph 24(c) of this Ruling, where a taxpayer is away from home overnight, **accommodation and meals expenses** incurred on overseas study tours, on work-related conferences or seminars, or attending an educational institution; and
- (e) Interest incurred on borrowed monies where the funds are used to pay for self-education expenses associated with a course of education that enables a taxpayer to maintain or improve his or her skill or knowledge or is likely to lead to an increase in income from the taxpayer's current income-earning activities. Regard must be had to the connection between the interest expense and the income-earning activity in each income year interest is claimed because a change in circumstances, for example, a change of employment, may mean that the necessary connection no longer exists.
